ROTATION SPECIFIC COMPETENCY OBJECTIVES

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Patient Care:

By the end of the rotation, the G3 resident will:

- Partner with patients, families and communities to improve health through disease prevention and health promotion in all patients
- Demonstrates the ability to provide preventive care to patients with complex health care needs
 including the homebound, the homeless, refugees and immigrants, patients with chemical
 dependency
- Understand the medical and psychosocial issues that create complexity in the care of patients with homebound, the homeless, refugees and immigrants, patients with chemical dependency
- Experience enhanced patient care through broadening their continuity relationships by visiting several primary patients in their homes
- Identifies the roles of behavior, social determinants as factors in health promotion and prevention to patients with complex care needs.
- Experience the range of services offered through rehabilative medicine

Medical Knowledge:

By the end of the rotation, the G3 resident will:

- Utilize information technology by asking a clinical question, developing a search strategy and producing a critically appraised topic (CAT) summarizing the evidence that answers the question
- Demonstrate the process of informed clinical decision making
- Integrate medical and personal knowledge of patients, family and community in the development of and implementation of treatment plans for patients with complex care needs including chemically dependent

Practice-Based Learning and Improvement

By the end of the rotation the G3 resident will:

- Accept constructive feedback
- Present self-education on medical and community topics
- Define the salient facts necessary to educate patients on medical topics
- Recognize personal limitations in knowledge
- List sources of additional information
- Understand appropriate feedback and request it from supervisors

Systems-Based Practice

By the end of the rotation, the G3 resident will:

- Describe how to evaluate and order cost-effective tests and labs
- Explain how to encourage and facilitate timely discharge planning
- Describe the appropriate use of multidisciplinary care team meetings

- Exhibit skills facilitating effective patient advocacy
- Describe the role of OT, PT, Social work and case managers in rehabilitation
- Collaborate with public and community health organizations to educate, guide ,implement and evaluate community initiatives

Professionalism

By the end of the rotation, the G3 resident will:

- Recognize cultural differences and their impact on patient care
- Develops a shared understanding of needs and desires of patients and families
- Demonstrates early leadership skills regarding cultural proficiency and social determinants of health
- Formulate a plan of care that incorporates the patient's and family's preferences
- Demonstrate protection of a patient's privacy
- Demonstrate a commitment to professionalism and self-care through review and application of one's own self care plan

Interpersonal Skills and Communication:

By the end of the rotation, the G3 resident will:

- Identify three potential barriers to good care and communication experienced in the community.
- Suggest different strategies to eliminate communication barriers
- Facilitate and plan for the effective use of interpreters
- Apply techniques of effective communication when interacting with consultants, team **members** and members of the allied health team
