ROTATION SPECIFIC GOALS & OBJECTIVES

Patient Care:

Objectives

By the end of the rotation, the G1 resident will:

- Manage preterm contractions and labor and precipitous labor
- Document labor and antepartum admission history and physical and gives complete presentation to senior residents and attending
- Develop a management plan for normal and abnormal labor including diagnosis, augmentation and arrested labors
- Diagnose and manage fetal distress
- Diagnose and manage common antepartum conditions, including preterm labor, vaginal bleeding and hypertensive disorders of pregnancy
- Perform procedures, essential to obstetrics including but not limited to vacuum extraction, amniotomy, FSE placement, IUPC placement, perineal repair, management of post-partum hemorrhage, newborn circumcision, interpretation of fetal monitoring, management of shoulder dystocia, induction and augmentation of labor
- Identify the consultant's role in the management of problems arising during prenatal and antenatal period
- Understand the role of each member of the health care team, including residents, faculty, nurses and works well with all to ensure excellent patient care

Medical Knowledge:

Objectives

By the end of the rotation, the G1 resident will:

- Understand the pathophysiology of preterm labor, vaginal bleeding, hypertensive disorders of pregnancy, infections in pregnancy and liver diseases in pregnancy
- Select clinical guidelines and evidence-based medicine concerning patient problems
- Learn the appropriate use of medications during pregnancy and breastfeeding
- Demonstrate ability to identify and prevent drug interactions
- Demonstrate consistent ability to obtain information about the use of various medications during pregnancy

Practice-Based Learning and Improvement

Objectives:

By the end of the rotation, the G1 resident will:

- Accept constructive feedback
- Present self education on obstetric topics
- Define the salient facts necessary to educate patients on obstetric topics
- Recognize personal limitations in knowledge

- List sources of additional information
- Understand appropriate feedback and request it from supervisors

- Define the benefits of cost-effective tests and labs
- Outline the steps necessary in prescribing medication safely, in a cost effective manner
- List factors necessary to facilitate discharge planning
- Name the team members necessary to organize and arrange an appropriate discharge
- Begin to participate in multidisciplinary care team meetings

Professionalism

Objectives:

By the end of the rotation, the G1 resident will:

- Consistently arrive on time
- Consistently use respectful language and attitudes toward patients, colleagues, faculty and staff
- State the importance of a patient's privacy
- Define sensitivity to cultural difference
- State the importance of a family's preferences in formulating a plan of care
