Precise schedule depends on availability of specific Pediatric attending, Pediatric resident block teaching (on Friday afternoons) and other variables.

Residents will generally have

2-4 primary care clinics per week (NOT tied to anchor days)

4 full days of Pediatric clinic time at Brooklyn Park per month (8 half day sessions)

2 half days working with Dr Colianni on Tuesday mornings alongside the "HELIX" medical student

6 half days (including evenings) of CSC Pediatric Walk In clinic.

Shadow Dr. DeCanini, Peds Ophthalmology on Friday morning twice during the block.

Shadow Pediatric SLP/ OT one half day each during the block

Shadow WHC Dental technician Eva Romero 2 half days during the block

Monday – Friday: if resident is not scheduled for clinic, conference, i.e., a blank session, resident is expected to be present in the Resident Room at WHC and working on rotation assignments.
