Rotation Description

Internal Medicine Inpatient ICU: G2 residents rotate on the HCMC Internal Medicine Intensive Care Unit Service (MICU). They care for adult medicine patients who are critically ill in the intensive care unit and afterwards on the wards. All residents attend Morning Report and noon conferences. Twice daily rounds are held to assure supervision and teaching.

Educational Content of Rotation

Procedures

Procedures that may be learned or reinforced on this rotation include but are not limited to:

- Lumbar puncture
- Paracentesis
- Thoracentesis
- Ventilation management
- Central line placement

Interpretive Skills:

Various Interpretive skills that may be reinforced or learned during the rotation include but are not limited to:

- ABG / VGB Interpretation
- Chest X ray and EKG interpretation; VS / CT / MRI – interpretation of radiology report
- Serum electrolytes and routine chemistry panel, complete blood count, liver function tests, coagulation studies and similar / appropriate
- Urinalysis and urine cultures
- Blood culture results;
- PFTs (pulmonary function tests), CSF (Cerebrospinal fluid) results, other culture results as indicated

Teaching Methods

- Direct patient care of ICU patients
- Teaching during patient rounds
- Intensive lectures / conferences
- Independent reading
- Procedural learning (see above list)

Assessment Methods

- Completion of rotation evaluation by supervising ICU faculty

Level of Supervision

- Residents are supervised by senior Internal Medicine residents, ICU fellows and ICU faculty in compliance with departmental policy
